<u>Vicki Birchfield</u>, professor in the Ivan Allen College of Liberal Arts, received one of France's highest civilian honors for her continued dedication to furthering Franco-American relations. Birchfield rose to the rank of Officer of France's National Order of Merit, 13 years after being honored as "Chevalier," or Knight of the National Order of Merit.



Three researchers with the Georgia Tech Research Institute — <u>Garrett Brown</u>, <u>Justin Hsu</u>, and <u>Drew Petry</u> — placed second in the Southeastern Cyber Cup competition, a multiday, national-level, higher education competition and cyber hacking event.

A team of researchers featuring Professor <u>Biing-Hwang Juang</u> has received the 2023 IEEE Signal Processing Society Best Paper Award for their work on deep learning enabled semantic communication systems. Juang is the Motorola Foundation Chair Professor in the School of Electrical and Computer Engineering and a Georgia Research Alliance Eminent Scholar.
